

New EPA Polluted Runoff Rules Imminent

Would force towns to get more rainwater into ground, rather than running off into streams and rivers, bringing major benefits:

- Cleaner Rivers
- Improved Low Flows in Summer
- More Reliable and Protected Drinking Water

efore there were roads, parking lots, and other hard "impervious" surfaces that water can't penetrate, rainwater and melting snow would mostly seep into the ground, recharging aquifers.

During times of low precipitation, this ground water would slowly seep into rivers and streams, maintaining a base level of streamflow even in summer and providing a reliable source of drinking water even when it didn't rain.

Modern development brought more impervious surfaces ranging from streets and parking lots to the roofs and driveways of our own homes. The flow of water after storms changed dramatically:


Rather than seep into the ground to recharge aquifers, water runs off the surfaces, picking up oil, grit, pet waste, trash and other pollutants, and into the nearest stream.

The new rules are part of the Clean Water Act, and while the new rules were just recently issued, the government is allowing towns two years to provide plans for complying. The new rules will reduce this pollution by getting more of the runoff back into the ground. There, it is cleaned naturally, it seeps into streams slowly like it used to do, and it maintains aquifers for our drinking water.

Public education and NSRWA

In addition to cleaning stormwater catch basins, using new porous surfaces that water can pass through and into the ground, and many other structural requirements, the new rules require that municipalities increase their public education efforts. Two constituencies that towns must reach are their residential and business communities.

What Is a Healthy River?

How do NSRWA programs work together to achieve Healthy Rivers?

e define a healthy river as one that supports a full range of both human and ecological uses.

For humans, healthy rivers have water quality and quantity that support fishing, swimming, boating, and esthetic and drinking water uses.

Ecologically, healthy rivers provide water quality and quantity, streamflow and habitat connectivity

that support biodiversity and resilience to change.



These are diverse concepts, but our river restoration programs are interrelated to achieve multiple benefits. Sound science, persistence, and a focus on engagement with our communities have yielded broad results.



For instance:

1st Herring Brook

Scituate has a water supply problem. By working with Scituate leaders to solve their supply problem through water conservation and structural adjustments to the town's reservoir dams, we also improved streamflow in 1st Herring Brook, restored connectivity between the ocean and Reservoir Dam, and allowed the first herring in decades to swim beyond Old Oaken Bucket Dam.

3rd Herring brook

Norwell and Hanover also have water supply problems, but unlike Scituate their water systems only use town wells. We are working with the towns to model their water use and its stresses on 3rd Herring Brook, and together

> with them will detail a program of water conservation and use to both increase the reliability of their water supplies and enhance streamflow and habitat.

Polluted runoff control

Our lead article on page 1 describes new EPA rules controlling polluted runoff. NSRWA will work with towns across the watershed to implement these rules, simultaneously improving habitat by reducing pollution and increasing low flows, and increasing drinking water reliability by increasing aquifer recharge.

Land conservation

The North River Greenway, a succession of protected properties enhanced in 2015 with

NSRWA can help. We worked with Scituate to educate residents about water conservation, and our town-supported Greenscapes program already takes conservation education into eleven South Shore communities. We have initiated our first water-use education program focused on our South Shore business community, WaterSmart Business (see next article).

We believe it is a natural fit for NSRWA to expand these local partnerships, and contract with communities to help educate residents and businesses about both water conservation and polluted runoff.

Water Smart Business: Promoting Water Conservation and Controlling Polluted Runoff Through Direct Business Education

ur South Shore rivers and streams are among the most stressed in Massachusetts, and low flow, especially in summer, is one of their gravest threats.

Water conservation directly enhances streamflow by keeping water in the ground to seep slowly into the river during periods of low precipitation. And controlling runoff after storms, so that it seeps into the ground rather than rushing over parking lots and quickly into the rivers, not only reduces pollution but also helps to recharge aquifers.



With better information, many of our South Shore businesses could reduce their water use, reduce polluted runoff, and save money at the same time. The goal of WaterSmart is to help them accomplish that.



How WaterSmart works

Enrolled businesses will receive a water-use report that details consumption patterns and ways to reduce polluted runoff. The business owner will then be presented options to reduce water consumption and polluted runoff.

Assessments for Cardigan Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Scituate and Planet Subaru in Hanover are already completed, and we are recommending 30% and 50% conservation measures respectively. ProtectoWire in Pembroke, Clean Harbors in Norwell and Cravings in Kingston are also participating in the program.

With initial funding from local towns and the McKim Family Foundation, our goal through June is to have engaged ten businesses in this new program. While ten businesses is a small number, we expect that many more in later years will embrace this opportunity to save money while doing the right thing.

2015 TREASURER'S REPORT

irst, I am excited to be your new treasurer. Having lived on the North River now for ten years, seeing our mission in action has continued to expand my point of view on our watershed and the need for NSRWA.



From a financial perspective, 2015 was a good year. I credit great

fiscal leadership from Samantha and her team, and the engagement and support by you our members; without you we would not be able to do all that we do! Richard Leach, our treasurer for the past twelve years, laid a solid financial foundation for our organization and we sincerely appreciate his dedication.

Membership income for 2015 was the second highest in the organization's history and exceeded our 2015 plan, however it was 8.1% behind the record 2014 year. As in past years we continue to look for members who can step up to our River Guardian Circle by contributing \$500 or more annually to the NSRWA. While every member is important, our River Guardians provide us the incremental lift necessary to achieve our goals. This group represents just over 5% of our members but contributes nearly 60% of our membership income.

The value of our endowment fund at the end of 2015 was \$123,088. We began the fund in 2008 to provide NSRWA with a long term financial stability vehicle and now have more than doubled the initial investment. In the first quarter of 2016 we added \$25,000 to the fund which will bring the total to over \$148,000. This new investment is the result of a bequest from the estate of Mary Eliot.

We established the Legacy Circle in 2014 to recognize those generous individuals like Mary who planned to leave bequests to the NSRWA. Gifts like these are essential to supporting the long term mission of the NSRWA and we encourage others to consider including the NSRWA in your estate plans. Should you have questions regarding such planning, please contact the office for assistance.

From a program perspective, 2015 was a good year. As many of you know we received a gift of a pontoon boat late in

2014 which allowed us to take people for eco or history tours of the North River. We exceeded every expectation for this new program, and plan to expand it in 2016 with the addition of a youth 'Science on the Rivers' program supported by a grant from the Battelle Institute. Also this past year our president Peter Kelly-Detwiler and his pals raised over \$11,000 by doing the historical Wampanoag Paddle. (Again!)

Lastly, as we look to 2016, our new strategic plan highlighted some needed investments. We are investing in a new leadership structure to respond to increasing market demands from the towns across the watershed. In addition, we are continuing to invest in new technology to better connect and support our members and run the organization more efficiently. While these changes will require increased capital investments we feel financially we are in the best position we have been in years to invest in the future and that is in large part because of you!
